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# FOREWORD TO CASE STUDIES

**This section demonstrates, through six case studies, how our strategies could be implemented. The first 3 are area based and examine how elected members, community networks, the parish and town councils, stakeholders and members of the public would be able to interact under a new framework of governance.**

It is important to emphasise the fact that these case studies do not describe everything that could be achieved following restructuring; they are indicative of the sorts of opportunities that would emerge and have been designed to clarify how a single authority in Cornwall may choose to operate. Case studies 4, 5 and 6 are service based and outline how regulatory services, planning and ICT could function following the establishment of a single council. Each study adds to the picture of a community network and they should be viewed collectively to see their full potential.

It is anticipated that this proposal will evolve beyond its submission to government on the 25th January 2007. It is likely, therefore, that the detail of the proposition will be refined over the course of the next few months. In the first instance, for example, the county council will be consulting with the government, its partners and members of the public on the proposed shape of the new authority – its organisational structure, procedures and processes. It is anticipated that this will facilitate the design of a structure of local government that meets the needs of everyone in Cornwall.
