

Information on traditional kerb graves



1. The size of the memorial must not exceed 1370 mm high x 900 mm wide and the kerbs must not enclose an area exceeding 2100 mm x 1070 mm. The maximum size of kerbs visible above ground level shall be 150 mm x 150 mm. The area enclosed must not exceed the height of the kerb.
2. Subject to the written consent of the Council, and to payment of the prescribed fee, a memorial and kerbs may be placed in the position required by the Council.
3. The memorial shall become the property of the Council at the expiry date of the period of the Grant of the Exclusive Right of Burial in the grave.
4. The Council must approve all inscriptions on the memorial beforehand.
5. The number of the grave must be cut into the side of the memorial so as to be visible.
6. All monuments must be kept in good repair at the expense of the owner of the Exclusive Right of Burial. The Council reserves the right to remove any monument which, in their opinion has become unsafe, dilapidated or unsightly, or is not kept in good repair.
7. Requests for placing of items on the grave shall be submitted through the Registrar for consideration by the Registrar of Cemeteries. The decision of the Registrar of Cemeteries shall be final.
8. **Memorials may only be fixed by approved Monumental Masons.**
9. The Council reserves the right to remove any item placed on or near a grave that does not conform to the Regulations, **without prior notice or right of appeal.**
10. The Exclusive Right of Burial will exist for a period of **50 years.**
