

BAR CRAWL / TOUR – CODE OF CONDUCT 2011

1. Written Risk Assessments and copy of £5million Public Liability Insurance to be submitted to Cornwall Council and Police **1 month** before commencement of operation.
2. Routes of operation to be determined by the Police – Can only use Fore Street, Central Square, Bank Street, East Street, Beach Road and Gover Lane **Cannot use Beachfield Avenue, Tramtracks, Trebarwith Crescent, Killacourt, The Crescent (Residential part) or Crantock Street**
3. Ratio of Marshalls to be 1 per 20 number of patrons
4. Maximum of 50 patrons per group. The premises will not accept larger groups
5. Marshalls to wear identifiable tops (either T-shirts or jackets)
6. Marshalls are not to drink any alcohol
7. No consumption of alcohol in a public place by any patron or anyone involved in the bar crawl
8. No games which encourage or call for the revealing of breasts, genitalia or simulation of sex to be played in public place **or within the licensed premises**. When these actions occur spontaneously they are to be stopped.
9. No games at all in any public space
10. Start time for crawl must not be before **2000hrs** and cannot depart meeting venue until after **2045hrs**. Must reach final destination by **2345hrs**
11. A central briefing to be given by organisers to patrons to include: Alcohol Restriction Zones, Non Acceptance of Anti- Social Behaviour, and that they cannot remain on the crawl if they become drunk.

12. Patrons to be easily identifiable to the Police.
13. The Bar Tour organiser is to ensure they have a Pubwatch Radio which enables them to contact CCTV and to be contacted by CCTV/premises doorstaff and Police at any time. The radio is their responsibility and they are to call in to CCTV at the beginning of each tour.
14. Pre-booked places on the crawl only
15. No cash transactions in the town centre at any time of day in relation to the bar crawl
16. Written permission of private landowners to be shown to Police or Council upon request if trading from private premises. Any private premises where sales are made will be approached by the Council and/or Police to verify permission is given if no written consent supplied. Landowners and Business Rates will also be informed in case of any breach of tenancy and rates obligation.
17. Challenge 25 ID scheme to be used and only acceptable forms of ID are Passport or driver's licence or PASS card
18. No selling of bar crawl tickets/ entry after 2100hrs for that night
19. Code of Conduct to be clearly displayed on website of any Bar Crawl/Tour organiser
20. No "Mankinis" to be worn by patrons
