<p>1 Welcome and Introductions</p> <p>John Bastin CC, Community Network Panel Chair welcomed all present.</p>	
<p>2 Public Questions</p> <p>None received.</p>	
<p>3 Together for Families and Volunteer Cornwall</p> <p>Louise Hamilton, CC Early Help Team Leader and Amy Brooks, Volunteer Cornwall provided presentations to the Panel (attached with notes) and gave an update on the impact of the recent months on local families in the network area.</p> <p>LH explained the contract with Volunteer Cornwall ends in January 2021 and is hoping to pick up and work with the Local Alliance organisations and continue the good work.</p> <p>CLlr Michelle Wilkinson thanked Volunteer Cornwall for their valuable support, resources and knowledge during recent months.</p>	
<p>4 Local Outbreak Management Plan</p> <p>Ruth Goldstein, CC Public Health Consultant provided the Panel with a presentation (attached with notes) and overview of the LOMP and how Cornwall Council and partners will work together to manage any local outbreaks of Covid 19 in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.</p> <p>Concern was raised from Mabe Parish Council as one of the host parishes of the University regarding the use of HALO covid testing and whether they can be informed of the results.</p> <p>RG will follow up and respond to MW, Mabe Parish Council. Cllr Peter Williams also stated he would request a view from Falmouth University.</p> <p>There was further discussion on the current testing facilities and capacity, and how to deal with real cases versus coughs/colds etc.</p> <p>RG explained that current testing is difficult as there are not enough laboratories to be able to process the test, and there needs to be an appropriate use of the tests as people are requesting a test for incorrect symptoms. Currently working very closely with schools to make sure they are giving parents the right message. If there is a confirmed case in a school bubble all children in the bubble and their contacts will have to isolate for 14 days. This a national directive.</p> <p>NHS staff and Care Homes are accounting for approximately 100 tests per day so need to prioritise who gets the remaining tests.</p>	RG & PW

5	<p>Town and Parish Council Updates</p> <p><u>Mawnan Parish Council</u> Neighbourhood Development Plan is currently in the Consultation stage. Permission has been granted to do this online due to current pandemic and the period has been extended to enable time for more people to respond.</p> <p><u>Mylor Parish Council</u> Neighbourhood Development Plan Consultation finished last week (also online).</p> <p><u>St Gluvias Parish Council</u> Cllr Willcocks reported that Zoom meetings are working very well and have supported people who have been isolated. They have also allowed smaller ad hoc meetings to take place that would have been difficult to arrange previously.</p>	
6	<p>Cornwall Councillor Updates</p> <p><u>Councillor Williams</u> Speeding in Perranarworthal – still capturing data on vehicles speeding through the village and submitting the weekly stats to CC. Almost 50% of vehicles are speeding which equates to 15,000 per week. JP agreed to take this forward as Corporate Leadership Team Representative. Cllr Williams received a letter from the University explaining how they plan to protect Penryn, Falmouth and Mabe regarding Covid.</p>	JP
