## 3 Speeding

#### Natalie Warr, CC Local Transport and Road Safety Lead

NW provided a presentation on Covid-19 Speeding Trends.



# Sector Inspector Dan Harvey

DH gave an overview from a Police perspective.

- Complaints of speeding vehicles have to work out if speed is perception or real issue. A number of modern cars have different modes, wider tyres, louder exhausts etc that all give perception of speed.
- If an issue is identified, will involve Safety Camera Partnership to capture footage as well as speed data.
- Community Speedwatch a number of schemes in the sector.
- PCSO speedwatch sessions with school children.
- New Special Constable in Launceston a real benefit and he has a keen interest in Community Speedwatch.

Minutes Action

Increased workload at present due to Summer Policing Plan –
 speeding is therefore a lower priority during this time.

#### Oliver Jones, CC Area Highway Manager

OJ gave a brief overview of the Community Network Highways Scheme.

- A number of schemes have been completed, some are completed, some in construction phase and others in consultation phase.
- Spend to date £127,000
- Still schemes allocated for Year 4
- Will update at next meeting small amount of money remaining.
- Flashing Speed Sign (Pipers Pool) confirmed Highways are aware of current issues regarding solar panel covered by tree. Works should be done in next few weeks.

### Graham Curzon, Community Speedwatch

GC gave a brief overview of Launceston Community Speedwatch

- Launched 2018 with 4 Volunteers.
- Aims to educate drivers rather than issue Court fines.
- Uses a staged warning system which can also be escalated to the police to look at possible prosecution.
- Currently 7 approved sites.
- 7 Volunteers in total however only 3 currently available due to Covid-19.
- Speedwatch to recommence Monday 20<sup>th</sup> July.
- A proactive solution to improve the safety and quality of life for everyone in the community.
