Item	Key/Action Points	Action by:
1.	<p>Welcome and Introductions</p> <p>The Chairman, Cornwall Councillor Dick Cole, welcomed everyone to the meeting. Noted that Cllr Cole was chairing the meeting on behalf of Cllr Saunders who was unable to attend.</p>	
2.	<p>Cybercrime</p> <p>Grahame Mace, Cyber Protect Officer gave an update on Cybercrime. Please see attached summary from Grahame which includes the links referred to in his update.</p> <p><u>Questions and Answers</u></p> <p>Q. Is there any specific support aimed at Young People?</p>	

	<p>A. Information guides and videos including the 'Little Media' guides can be found on the Metropolitan Police website; https://www.met.police.uk/littlemedia</p> <p>Q. We are often asked 'save this password to computer'. Is this advisable?</p> <p>A. Saving passwords using 'password manager' can help as it ensures you don't lose or forget passwords and can even protect against some cybercrime, such as fake websites. Top tips on how to generate a strong password, such as using catchphrases, can be found on the National Cyber Security Centre website; https://www.ncsc.gov.uk/cyberaware/home</p> <p>Q. Cybercrime appears to be easily committed but so difficult to prevent? How can we stop unwarranted contact particularly from foreign 'call centres'?</p> <p>A. Millions of phishing calls and emails are sent out every single day by criminal networks operating across the world making it extremely hard to prevent. 'Call blocking' is advisable and also encouraging people to report scams so we can continue to highlight and raise awareness.</p> <p>The Chairman thanked Grahame for his helpful and informative update.</p>	
3.	<p>Young People Cornwall (YPC) Donna Hobday updated on their work across the China Clay area and potential opportunities to work with parishes. Please see attached presentation.</p> <p><u>Questions, Comments and Answers</u></p> <p>Q. Foxhole Youth Club has remained closed following lockdown. When can it restart?</p> <p>A. Youth Clubs are able to meet again as youth work is classed as an essential service, however, there is a lot of guidance to follow which YPC can help with.</p> <p>C. The feedback refers to 22 young people in St Stephen wanting a youth club. The main issue is trying to find a suitable venue and volunteers but it is hoped to move forward with this in the New Year.</p> <p>Q. How do you start up a Youth Club?</p> <p>A. YPC are able to assist with all aspects from safeguarding guidance to health and safety policies.</p> <p>As anti-social behaviour issues are a concern across the network, it was agreed that TD will arrange a meeting with YPC and parish councils to further discuss potential opportunities for joint working and the proposed offer from YPC.</p>	TD
4.	<p>Community Safety Inspector Ed Gard (Devon and Cornwall Police), Helen Toms (Anti-Social Behaviour Caseworker, Cornwall Council) and Zoe Wonnacott (Community Safety Officer, Cornwall Council) were welcomed to the meeting and briefly outlined their roles and current issues. The following points were noted;</p> <p><u>Helen Toms, Anti-Social Behaviour Case Worker</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The majority of asb issues concerning under 18's are in the China Clay area. 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bugle is having particular issues. HT is working closely with Councillor Saunders, neighbourhood policing team and Young People Cornwall. HT thanked partners for their intervention work which has resulted in a number of warnings issued. • HT to provide figures for the China Clay area (including St Enoder which is covered by the Newquay sector). <p><u>Zoe Wonnacott, Community Safety Officer</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The team co-ordinates partnership responses where there are persistent issues that normal processes cannot resolve. • The Council's Amethyst Intelligence Team collates statistics on rough sleepers, asb incidents, numbers accessing drug and alcohol support services etc. Please see attached data for the China Clay area. <p><u>Inspector Ed Gard, Devon and Cornwall Police</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • St Austell sector is one of the 3 busiest sectors in the force. • EG updated on latest crime figures. It was noted that the figures relate to the sector as a whole and not specifically for the China Clay area. However, due to system changes, it was hoped to be able to extract this data in the near future. <p><u>Questions and Answers</u></p> <p>Q. Residents have complained of motorbikes using the bridleways making them impassable for horse riders and pedestrians and causing a noise nuisance for those living nearby. Residents have received threats when approaching the offenders.</p> <p>A. The police are aware and PCSO Tibbles is working with the Cormac countryside officer to try and find a way forward. Inspector Gard will feedback to the roads policing team to ask them to monitor. Noted that action can be taken on other public order offences such as threats if its reported and individuals identified. Similar issues are also happening in Lanner and ZW will feedback any potential outcomes that could assist.</p> <p>Q. Many reported incidents are ongoing and require regular follow up but this is not reflected in the crime figures/dashboard data.</p> <p>A. The data is based on the number of reported incidents so it's imperative that people report issues so it can be logged and signposted to the relevant agencies to ensure the right support is offered. It's also essential in helping the police to bid at senior level for resources for their area.</p> <p>Inspector Gard, Helen and Zoe were thanked for their attendance and helpful input.</p>	<p>HT</p> <p>EG</p> <p>ZW</p>
5.	<p>China Clay Area Strategy</p> <p>Councillor Cole updated on the Economic Vitality of Rural and Coastal Areas in Cornwall - Member Inquiry at which he was a witness. There were concerns at comments made that the strategy could be adapted for other areas as it was felt this did not take account of the uniqueness of the China Clay area.</p> <p>Child poverty figures and China Clay industry data has been updated as previously agreed. Further data to be provided from the Economy Growth & Development Service which will be added as an appendix to the strategy. It was agreed that reference should also be made to the potential for lithium mining explorations.</p>	<p>TD</p>

	The panel agreed to adopt the strategy subject to the inclusion of the Economic Growth appendix and the reference to lithium mining.

8.	<p>General Updates</p> <p>8.1 Minorca Lane and wider Gypsy & Traveller issues A Strategic Group with Heads of Service is now in place. An Operational Group has also been resurrected with representatives from across the relevant services and will be meeting monthly from January.</p> <p>Councillors Cole and Saunders will be meeting the newly appointed Head of Planning Policy on the 18th December to discuss the review of how sites are allocated.</p> <p>Councillor Luke referred to an issue concerning Hallaze Caravan Park. SH to follow up. Cllr Luke to email SH with details.</p> <p>8.2 Neighbourhood Planning – updates from NP groups in the China Clay area St Stephen – Following a meeting with Cornwall Council’s Affordable Housing Officer, the Parish Council understands that a housing needs survey now needs to be undertaken. Costs are currently awaited and will be discussed at their next meeting.</p> <p>8.3 St Austell to A30 Link Road Work is being finalised on the Side Road Orders and Compulsory Purchase Orders. A further bat survey needs to be undertaken. A site visit regarding the Common Land Exchange also needs to take place. The official sign-off has been delayed until the end of January.</p> <p>8.4 Climate Change - No updates reported.</p> <p>8.5 Anti-Social Behaviour - Discussed under min no 4.</p>	SH/ ML
