Item	Key/Action Points	Action by:
1.	<p>Welcome and Introductions</p> <p>The Chairman welcomed all present. The panel were informed that John Vine, Imerys and Paul Masters, CLT representative were retiring in March. Special thanks and appreciation were given to John and Paul for their invaluable support to the panel and best wishes extended to them for their upcoming retirements.</p>	

	<p>Gary Staddon was introduced as the new Imerys representative and was welcomed to the meeting.</p>	
2.	<p>Cornwall Energy Recovery Centre</p> <p>Tony Burge (Plant Manager) updated the panel on the damage sustained to the roof during the storms the previous weekend. Due to further challenging forecasted weather conditions, specialist safety inspections will not be undertaken until later that week. Waste deliveries and processing continue to be unaffected; however, electricity export to the National Grid is suspended as a precautionary measure. A further update will be provided following the inspection.</p> <p>Concerns were expressed that this has happened for the third time despite previous reassurances. Mr Burge advised that they are working with specialist roof design engineers to investigate the cause. Cornwall Council have also commissioned an independent specialist to work alongside them.</p> <p>Mr Masters assured the meeting that the costs of the repairs will be met by the contractor.</p>	
3.	<p>Update on Licensing Compliance, Neighbourhood & Public Protection, Cornwall Council</p> <p>Graham Bailey, Senior Licensing Officer (Licensing Compliance), Cornwall Council gave an overview of the work undertaken by the team. This includes caravan and park homes licences, as well as taxi and hackney carriage licences, animal licences, alcohol, entertainment & gambling licences, charitable licences etc.</p> <p>The additional post of Community & Environmental Enforcement Officer secured through Invest to Save has enabled more proactive work to be undertaken particularly with regard to caravan site compliance in the China Clay area. However, a growing concern is the escalating number of small 'satellite' sites emerging across the area.</p> <p>Discussion followed and frustration expressed that planning and licensing legislation does not dovetail together. However, the multi-agency group continues to work together to co-ordinate issues. Councillors Saunders and Wood are also attending meetings of the officer group. There also ongoing discussions with senior management regarding an escalation process.</p> <p>The panel has previously discussed the need for a review of gypsy and traveller policy and Councillor Saunders and Cole are following this up with officers.</p>	
4.	<p>Public Participation</p> <p><u>Planning Enforcement</u></p> <p>Reference was made to ongoing enforcement concerns and that the Council no longer publishes its cases following the implementation of GDPR. Mr Masters updated that a motion was submitted to full Council in January calling for greater transparency in planning enforcement proceedings and that the matter has been referred to the Cabinet for further consideration.</p>	

5.	<p>China Clay 2030 Vision and Action Plan – progress update An update was provided by Guy Thomas, Communities Area Manager – Mid (see attached).</p>	
6.	<p>Community Networks Highways Scheme – progress update TD will be meeting with Members over the next couple of weeks to discuss priorities and potential next schemes for further discussion at the April meeting.</p>	TD

8.	<p>General updates</p> <p><u>Minora Lane and wider Gypsy and Traveller issues</u> Addressed under min no 3.</p> <p><u>Trethowel Playing Field</u> The road has reopened following the recent works. Councillor Saunders was awaiting an update from Cormac.</p> <p><u>Neighbourhood Planning – updates from NP groups in the China Clay Area</u> The following updates were noted; <u>St Dennis</u> – looking to employ a consultant to help with the formulation and public consultation. <u>St Stephen-In-Brannel</u> – public consultation to take place later in the year. <u>St Enoder</u> – revised plan previously published following independent examination. Process delayed due to threat of potential judicial review by local developer. Awaiting update from Cornwall Council. <u>Treverbryn</u> – work has started on writing the policies and this is ongoing. <u>Roche</u> – passed at referendum in 2017. However, possible judicial review following challenge by local developer.</p> <p><u>St Austell to A30 Link Road</u> Final stages being signed off. It is hoped construction will commence by summer.</p> <p><u>Climate Change</u> Agreed to invite Steve Ford, Head of Environmental Growth and Partnerships to a future meeting.</p> <p><u>Anti-Social Behaviour</u> PSCO Tibbles updated on current asb issues being investigated in the area including parking issues at Treverbryn school, asb in Roche village and at Bugle railway station. TD advised that following a recent meeting with St Dennis Parish Council regarding asb and lack of provision of youth activities in the area, it is hoped to arrange a</p>	 TD TD
