1.	Welcome and Introductions The Chairman, Cornwall Councillor Dick Cole, welcomed everyone to the meeting.	
2.	Local Outbreak Management Plans (LOMP) – Ruth Goldstein, Public Health The plan sets out how Cornwall Council and partners will work together, with the NHS Track and Trace service, to manage local Covid-19 outbreaks. 	<p>Q. What's the latest position regarding half-term arrangements for schools? There are reports of some academies closing for 2-weeks to carry out 'deep cleans'?</p> <p>A. CC has not advised any school or academy to close for 2-weeks to carry out deep cleans. CC were only made aware of this today and the decision was made independently by the academy concerned. CC can assist them with their communications if requested but ultimately CC has no control over how academies choose to operate.</p> <p>Q. What has been the biggest challenge so far?</p> <p>A. The outbreak at the Tulip site in Pool, Redruth which affected a third of their workforce with over 170 positive cases. The timeliness of receiving data is also an issue; we cannot keep pace with social media as data needs to be verified by Public Health England before we can take appropriate action.</p> <p>Q. New regulations is allowing those who test positive to attend funerals, can we refuse this locally? (refers to regulation 2(3)(b)(v) under the self-isolation regulations).</p> <p>A. RG to follow up and report back to the panel.</p> <p>UPDATE: Please see Ruth's response in attached email</p> <p>Q. What is the general ruling for events particularly with regard to Remembrance Parades etc coming up?</p> <p>A. CCs Local Safety Advisory Group are working closely with event organisers to provide guidance and support for how events may go ahead in a planned and safe way.</p> <p>Thanks were given to Ruth for her helpful and informative presentation.</p>	RG

	<p>As agreed at the last meeting, the strategy has been revised by TD, Councillors Cole and Saunders to make it more succinct and with a clearer 'ask' to CC. The revised document was circulated to the panel for feedback.</p> <p>The following comments were noted;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The panel unanimously supports the strategy – the China Clay area is responsible for over 5% of the population in Cornwall but doesn't get the resources that towns with smaller populations receive. • Thanks were extended to TD, Councillors Cole and Saunders for the excellent revision. • Imerys statistics to be updated. GS to forward to TD. <p>The panel were asked to review the document and feedback any comments to TD by the end of October. <p>5.</p>	<p>Public Participation There were no members of the public present.</p>	
<p>6.</p>	<p>Community Networks Highways Scheme – progress update TD updated on current progress and confirmed that project briefs have been submitted for the proposals outlined at the last meeting.</p> <p>The Clerk to St Stephen-In-Brannel Parish Council advised that 20% of the residents in Whitemoor had contacted the Parish Council requesting support in obtaining traffic calming along Crown Road and North Road. An update was requested on an earlier Expression of Interest to look at a potential solution. Councillor Wood advised he was working with Highways to try and find a way forward but it was a complex situation. Following the earlier site visit held with the Portfolio Holder for Transport, he advised the Parish Council to contact Councillor Geoff Brown to request a copy of the Traffic Audit undertaken. Cllr Wood will also raise with Cllr Brown.</p> <p>Following discussion, it was felt there is a need to distinguish between what can be funded from the CNA highways budget and what should be funded from the Transport Plan.</p>	<p>LR JW</p> <p>TD</p>
<p>7.</p>	<p>General Updates</p> <p>7.1 Minorca Lane and wider Gypsy & Traveller issues Cllr Cole updated that the review of how sites are allocated has been delayed as officers are currently dealing with the Government's White Paper on changes to the planning system. Following the CLT report, Cllr Saunders was pleased to update that a new Strategic Group is in place and the first meeting was held recently.</p> <p>7.2 Neighbourhood Planning – updates from NP groups in the China Clay area No updates.</p> <p>7.3 St Austell to A30 Link Road</p>	

	<p>Work has been finalised on the Side Road Orders and Compulsory Purchase Orders which is a major step forward to completing the Business Plan. Awaiting completion of the Stopping Orders which will hopefully be signed-off later this month. Local companies including DPD at Victoria have also written to government lobbying for this vital road improvement.</p> <p>7.4 Climate Change The panel has previously made a commitment to include Climate Change as a standing agenda item for all its panel meetings. TD highlighted Cornwall Council's 'Carbon Neutral Cornwall Hive' which is a new web space for sharing information and ideas to help tackle climate change. It includes a really useful 'Ideas Bank' where anyone can post an idea. It also has an interactive map for listing low carbon initiatives and schemes, and information about funding for environmental projects.</p> <p>7.5 Anti-Social Behaviour Concerns were reiterated at the continuing increase in anti-social behaviour in some villages including Bugle and Roche since the loss of the PCSOs. The Chairman advised that the theme for the next meeting in December is Community Safety. Inspector Gard will be attending together with Anti-Social Behaviour and Community Safety Officers. Cllr Saunders requested that Young People Cornwall also be invited to discuss possible engagement opportunities. Agreed that questions will be submitted in advance of the meeting.</p> <p>Cllr Greenslade was pleased to report that the asb issues at Parkandillick were resolved and thanked Imerys for the additional security and helpful liaison. Cllr Clarke reported that issues in the St Dennis cemetery and playing fields had also improved. CCTV had been installed in the cemetery and, thanks to an anonymous donator, it will also be installed in the playing fields.</p>	<p>TD TD</p>
